Nominations open for SORTEE Leadership positions

Every November, SORTEE members elect three new members to the nine-member Board of Directors who govern the society. All board terms are three years in duration (**Concerned about a 3-year commitment? Don't be! See below.*) and begin the January following the election. This year, the available seats include:

1. Graduate student (student at the time of election)
2. Early career (<10 years of relevant experience post final degree)
3. Open (any SORTEE member is eligible)

We are also looking for volunteers to chair SORTEE committees in 2023. EcoEvoRxiv

EcoEvoRxiv ("Eco Evo Archive"), [launched in January 2019](#), is a free repository for manuscripts in ecology, evolutionary biology, conservation, and related fields. The repository welcomes empirical and theoretical work, reviews, and opinion pieces. Further, EcoEvoRxiv accepts pre-prints, post-prints, reports, and other documents.

We have two exciting announcements regarding the EcoEvoRxiv pre-print service. As of October 2022,

1. EcoEvoRxiv is officially a part of SORTEE.
2. EcoEvoRxiv is now hosted by the [California Digital Library](#). The official re-launch will happen during Open Access Week (Oct 24-30). For the brief period until the re-launch, EcoEvoRxiv will be unable to accept new pre-prints. The official CDL announcement of the re-launch will appear [here](#) on October 19.

SORTEE Conference 2022 recap

The [2022 SORTEE Conference](#) ran continuously for 50 hours on 11-13 July facilitating participation from people interested in openness, transparency, and reliability from around the world. This event was organized and run by a dedicated team of volunteers and sponsored by six additional organizations including PeerJ, Company of Biologists, The American Society of Naturalists, The Living Data Project, eLife, and Whitman College.

The conference consisted of:

- 5 plenary presentations (all available on [Youtube](#), [transcripts for various languages are also available](#)) from speakers on four continents.
- 14 Workshops, ranging from 'Testing and Adjusting for Publication Bias' to an 'Introduction to Pre-Registration'.
- 7 Hackathons, including 'Peer Code Review' and 'Identifying and Mapping Open Source Datasets'.
- 8 Unconferences, including discussions about 'Increasing Methodological Transparency' and 'New Data Editing at Journals in Ecology and Evolution'.
- 17 Short Presentations across three different blocks, including talks by 4 [SORTEE award winners](#) from 2021 and 2022 (Shvani, Patrice Pottier, Korryn Bodner, Benjamin Paffhausen).
